It has been a testing year for Northampton Saints Foundation as it has for everyone across the world managing the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. We started the new academic year knowing that funding and fundraising would be significantly reduced owing to the pandemic, yet realising that the number of young people needing our support would increase. Owing to the UK lockdowns, overnight the Foundation had to adapt quickly and innovate our service by working remotely to support schools, students and families through the unprecedented times. We are pleased to report that the Foundation remained open throughout the periods of lockdown enabling us to offer largely uninterrupted programmes in Northamptonshire and beyond.

Our team expanded to meet the increasing demand for our programmes in all departments, welcoming new education officers, heritage and finance leads, student mentors and apprentices, one of whom was a former student on our HITZ programme.

Despite the pandemic, we have maintained a stable financial position and have achieved our goals through strong leadership and commitment from the Foundation team who were agile, responsive and driven in generating funds to sustain the Foundation, whilst operating in the most challenging of circumstances.

I am incredibly proud of the achievements of the team this year, giving opportunities to the young people with highest needs and being able to expand and grow the Foundation to meet an ever-growing demand.

There are exciting plans for 2021/22 that include new areas of service delivery, additional hubs opening, new staff and new programmes, all of which support the Foundation's vision to give young people an opportunity to have a positive future.

Managing Director Statement

Catherine Deans



As with almost all other businesses and charities around the world 2020/21 proved the most challenging the Foundation has faced. We kept one thing in mind, the support of young people that needed it the most.

I could not have asked more from my team whose commitment, flexibility and understanding were exceptional. Every day the young people had a place to go offering security and stability at a time of upheaval.

We adjusted and evolved our education and inclusion programmes to work within recommendations and restrictions, delivering an extensive remote education offer whilst schools were closed, engaging young people in physical activity in their living rooms through sessions designed, recorded and delivered by our fundraiser, Adventurer and now Ambassador, Jack Fleckney and as soon as we could we returned to doing this face to face, giving schools and pupils guidance on social, emotional and physical wellbeing, so vital in these times.

During lockdown our Education Lead, Liam designed and launched our Foundations of Writing programme aiming to introduce or develop key fine and gross motor skills for children to become successful and confident writers. We are delighted with the take up of this programme following piloting and are excited to add this to our portfolio.

Due to the reputation of our Engage programme, we held discussions with the Police Crime Commissioner in Suffolk, and as a result signed an agreement with Ipswich Rugby Club opening our fourth Engage hub, supported by a grant from the Suffolk Community Foundation. We have advanced plans to continue the growth of Engage this academic year, we will support as many young people as we can who are struggling in mainstream education, helping them find a path to a positive future.

Our 16+ students on the Hitz and Engage+ programmes displayed resilience beyond their years in coping with significant change and challenge. Many of these young people achieved their qualifications and moved on from the Foundation with a broad range of skills to support their employability, training or education going forwards.

Whilst our Mobbs Own' heritage project ended in 2020, we spent some time analysing the purpose of our heritage department throughout lockdown and I am pleased to say we have placed the history of Northampton Saints at the forefront of our work, we will use the story of 1880 and Reverend Wathan Wigg's naughty boys club as our inspiration throughout all our work as we relaunch the heritage department in 2021.

Our inaugural Student Awards took place in July, it was an emotional, but uplifting evening recognising the brilliant outcomes from all of our young people, and we were delighted to welcome some of our key partners to be a part of the event. We hope that the 21/22 event will be much bigger without covid restrictions.

Our very tired Foundation building received a much-needed refurbishment in the summer, we are incredibly grateful to the local businesses who gave their time and materials free of charge to aid the creation of a contemporary, warm, and friendly environment where young people can feel welcome, safe, happy and engaged to learn.

We can only do the work we do with the generous support from many sponsors, volunteers, and partners. I am truly grateful to every person, company or organisation that gives time, products, ideas and expertise to the Foundation as we continue our growth and increase our impact across Northamptonshire and beyond, we aim to give young people the chance to have a positive future. Without doubt everyone that supports us is changing lives. Thank you to each and every one of you.

Education

Primary and Secondary programmes

Our education department has grown significantly over the last year despite the Covid-19 pandemic.

Almost overnight all education sessions moved to a virtual delivery model to support local schools and parents relieving pressure from school teachers, by providing ready to go lesson plans and essential exercises to get students active.

From January to March 2021 the Foundation worked with 17 schools, supporting 950 students. As restrictions lifted and following Government guidelines we returned to face-to-face teaching in Northamptonshire and beyond.

VALUES

‘Values’, our education programme, incorporates the core values of Northampton Saints Foundation and the sport of rugby throughout both classroom-based and practical multi-sport sessions.

Aimed at promoting wellbeing, building character, improving communication skills and developing the knowledge of the core values and how they are applied in and support real-life situations.

Our Values programme has gone from strength to strength being delivered within Primary, Secondary and SEND provisions and Pupil Referral Units.

For those who can’t travel to the Foundation, we offer schools the option to have Values at their school/setting or to travel to our partner Boost Trampoline Park where young people can enjoy the trampoline park for an hours’ worth of physical activity and fun alongside the Values programme.

Foundations of writing - intervention programme

The new academic year saw the launch of our newest programme, The Foundations of Writing.

This five week intervention programme is designed to develop, work on or introduce key fine and gross motor skills, through a multi-sport session approach, to support children and young people in becoming more successful and/or confident writers.

“The children, and teachers, are absolutely loving it! They are seeing the benefits from these sessions and the children are often asking, ‘When is Liam coming back?’. This has been such a positive programme for the school, and we are grateful to be a part of this trial period. Our teachers and TA’s have also been interested in what the children have engaged with and have started putting some aspects into their own provision”.

History in schools

With the Mobbs project concluded, our Education team have enjoyed continuing to share the story of Edgar Mobbs and the 7th Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment within schools.

In 2022 we are planning to develop a historical focused programme created as a collaboration between our Heritage and Education department, supporting the National Curriculum for schools.

Premiership Rugby Champions



The Foundation has continued to deliver it's Champions programme delivered alongside the Northampton Saints Community department. The programme uses the power of sport and rugby's values to provided inclusive and differentiated theory and practical-based sessions which aims to develop core skills across a 5-week duration.

Based upon the Premiership Rugby Champions App, schools can choose from three programmes:

Tackling Health
Tackling Numeracy
Tackling Character

During the Covid-19 pandemic our Tackling Character programme, which helps children to develop social and emotional skills, has seen over 108 hours delivered to over 1,414 students.

HITZ

This year we're proud to say the HITZ Premiership Rugby's award-winning education and employability programme has receive a 100% pass rate, in Functional Skills Maths and English, despite moving lessons to online during the pandemic.

HITZ is a Premiership Rugby's award-winning education and employability programme which uses rugby's core values to improve the personal, social and life skills to support young people back into education, training, apprenticeships and/or employment (NEET).

Lazim Miah

Age 18

Lazim arrived at the Foundation following a referral from CIRV (Community Initiative to Reduce Violence). He had sadly left school with no qualifications due to behaviour and the environment not fitting his learning style. During his time at school, Lazim fell into the wrong crowd. This group of people encouraged wrong doings, which led him to develop a gang behaviour mindset and culture. When he arrived at the Foundation, he was very much an introverted individual who was not rude or disrespectful but had levels of volatility and his behaviour had the potential to be very unpredictable.

After a temporary suspension from the HITZ programme, Lazim recognized that Shirley (HITZ Officer) and the rest of the team at the Saints Foundation were there to support and guide Lazim resulting in a complete mindset and behaviour change. Since then Lazim has taken every opportunity offered to him whilst at the Foundation to help himself advance further, alongside mentoring of other students. In this second year alone, not only was Lazim attending regularly, he was also working part time on a fixed term contract with Mercedes Benz. Following his contract ending there, he then decided to take on a money management role with the local council, which gave him work experience and a diploma in money management working with professional business clients. Now a Northampton Saints Foundation Apprentice, Lazim works across all programmes at the Foundation supporting students from a similar background.

During his time on HITZ, Lazim gained the following:

- BTEC Level 1 in Sport
- City and Guilds Level 2 Employability
- Northampton Saints Foundation Student Values Award
- CV and Interview Workshop
- Level 1 Barista Certification

He is an inspiration to our younger students and is regularly found helping to mentor those students on our other programmes, putting more of his spare time into helping us as a Foundation, something which we are unconditionally grateful for.

Like many of our programmes, Engage+, designed specifically to support Northampton College students who require additional learning support or are at risk of not being in education, employment, or training (NEET), moved to online teaching during lockdown.

Our students responded incredibly well, and a 92% pass rate was achieved.

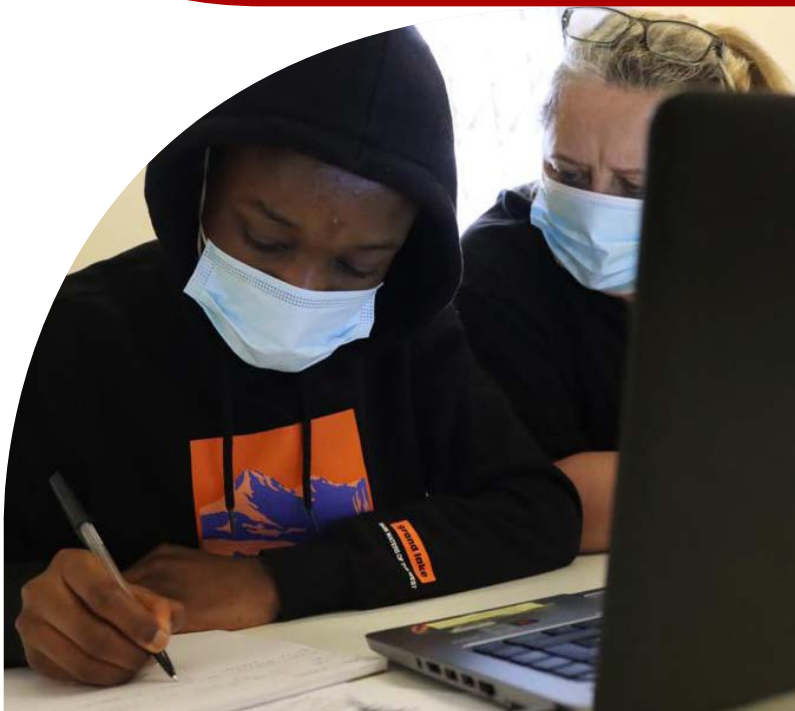

This year the Engage Primary and Secondary programme which works with students aged between 10-16 to increase confidence and boost self-esteem has supported 288 students aged between 8- 16 years old.

The programme has been running since 2015, supporting numerous students with complex needs. We have monitored the students' achievements via our student passport which evidences development in mental health, wellbeing, soft skills, school, friends, grades, well-being, confidence, and family.

Throughout the year young people have undertaken activity-based enrichment sessions supporting their reintegration into mainstream education. The programme as welcomed external guests who ran creative indoor and outdoor sessions focussing on wellbeing and mindfulness.



“There is such a need for a good alternative provision for students who cannot manage in school. There are not enough provisions in the town which can compare to Engage and the work they do for young people who are in need of this support.”

Due to the demand of the Engage programme, undoubtedly linked to the impact of the pandemic, the Foundation opened its fourth hub in Ipswich which will welcome its first cohort in November 2021.

As a result of our work 45% of our Engage students have now returned to full-time mainstream education, 20% are in the process of a transition back to mainstream education with ongoing support from our mentors, and 35% remain on the programme with us for the next academic year.

Beth*

Age: 10
Nationality: British

Beth*, a 10 year old girl with anxiety, had witnessed her brother with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) show aggression towards her mum and other members of the family as well as her brothers self-harm, self-injurious behaviour and destruction of property in the house which has left her refusing to leave the house, withdrawn and developing an attachment disorder to her mum.

As a result of attending the Engage programme Beth is now leaving the house, has seen a positive impact on her emotional wellbeing, has increased her confidence and developing resilience to deal with adverse situations.

Our Aspire programme, supported by the Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF), was more poignant than ever this year. Aimed at countering the triple inequalities facing Northamptonshire's and Milton Keynes' most disadvantaged young people with the aim to beat holiday hunger, physical inactivity, and social isolation.

Throughout the holidays young people enjoyed physical and enrichment activities such as pizza making, trips to the farm, Woburn safari park, multi-sports sessions, explore walking and Boost Trampoline Park.

Northampton Saints Foundation also ran sessions for a number of schools during the holidays and sessions with young carers.

Annual Student Awards

The Annual Student Awards were held at the end of the academic year and proved to be an incredibly important and special event in the Foundation’s calendar to celebrate the achievements of our students.

We were fortunate to have the support and expertise, of Graham McKechnie compering for the evening and our ambassadors, Tom Wood and James Grayson present awards.

All winners were incredibly worthy and well-deserving of their awards. The room was filled with emotion, pride and respect for the winners, and we wish them the best of luck as they go on to full time employment or further education.

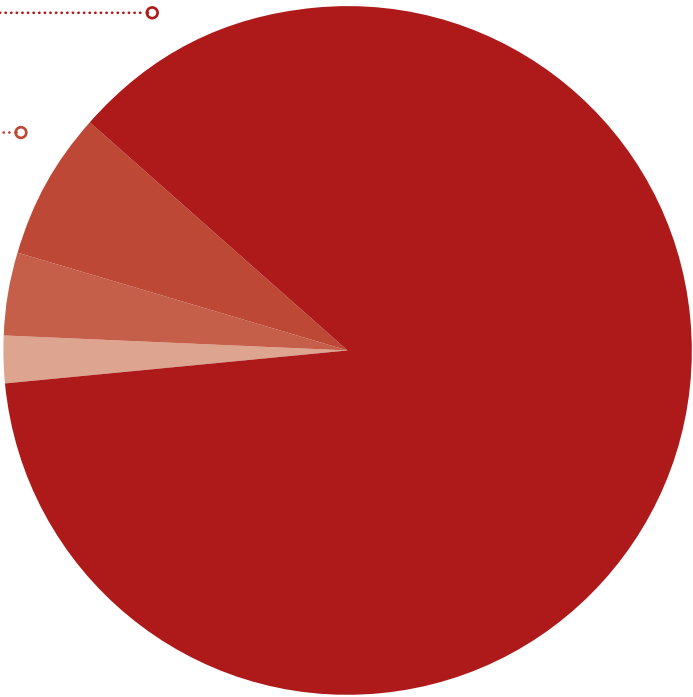
We are thankful, to everyone that supported us throughout this difficult year, ensuring that we secured sufficient funds to continue to grow our vital work into the 2021/22 academic year.

Annual Foundation Day

We held our first Foundation Day on 16th April 2021 at cinch Stadium at Franklin’s Gardens. Our purpose was to raise awareness of the Foundation and to recuperate some of the lost matchday fundraising income, which had been severely impacted by ongoing Covid-19 restrictions, and the inability to have fans in the stadium.

With covid still prevalent and no spectators at the game, we turned to online fundraising and raised £5,000 during the event through auctions, a raffle, Facebook donations, support through our Friend of the Foundation scheme and direct donations.

This is now an annual event in our calendar with planning for Foundation Day 2022 already under way. We are excited to build on this year’s event creating a high profile Foundation Day with the return of fans to Franklin’s Gardens.



Fundraising
Jack Fleckney

In 2021 the Foundation welcomed Jack Fleckney, its first non-player ambassador.

After spending much of his youth playing rugby, Jack joined the military and became a Royal Marines Commando at the age of 18. Over the next five years Jack visited over 20 countries, and when deciding it was time for a new adventure, gave his notice and set up a gym franchise. Soon Jack knew that this challenge wasn't going to be enough to meet his intrinsic need. Today, Jack has embarked on a life journey as a full-time adventurer that requires him to push himself to limits physically and mentally and he uses his story so far to inspire young people at the Foundation.

In 2020 Jack completed his first challenge in aid of the Foundation, by smashing the World Record for the furthest distance on a ski-erg machine in 24 hours, raising over £7,000.

Jack announced his second challenge in 2021, this time aiming to beat the 24-hour chin up World Record. After six months of training and around 50,000 chin ups to prepare Jack's effort was immense. The huge event took place on specially erected stages and platforms at Franklin's Gardens, with a range of recording and tracking equipment expertly provided by Video Inn Productions. Numerous corporate supporters, including Gymshark had donated significant sums



and supported Jack in his preparation and into the challenge. Carly Wilford, James Haskell, Martin Offiah and other local DJ's created a party atmosphere, the Saints players joined the event after their final game of the season and Jack battled through the night, fighting an injury sustained very late in his training plan. After a phenomenal performance, the injury prevented him from completing the whole 24 hours and breaking the record. Jack finally stepped away from the bar at around 4.30am having completed a heroic 3,296 chin-ups.

Whilst disappointed at not taking the World Record Jack raised almost £45,000! This will go towards adding space to support the work with disadvantaged young people that come to the Foundation. We have no doubt that once injury free and ready to go again, this World Record will belong to Jack, and we will be there with him to witness it!

Jack is driven to help children and committed to raising money to give them a new opportunity. He won the Overall Contribution award at the annual Foundation awards, was a finalist in the HITZ Champion Award, he has also been nominated for the local BBC's Sport Personality of the Year.

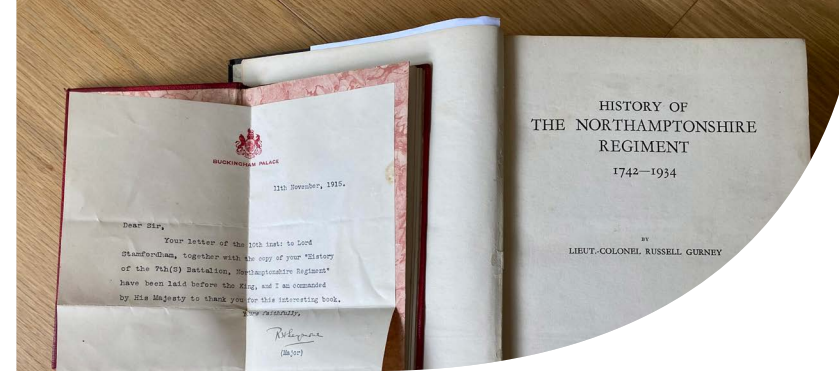

Heritage

We are pleased to relaunch our Heritage department in 2021/22. Clare Clarke joined the team as Heritage Lead and with the support of Club Historian, Graham Mckechnie, they will continue to protect and preserve the history of Northampton Saints.

In March 2021 Graham, and Saints captain Alex Waller pledged their help to renovate the grave of the first man to hold the position. Jim Barker had moved to the town as a teenager and worked as a painter and decorator before leading the team out on Saturday afternoons. His grave is covered in weeds and has no headstone, following his burial at Dallington Cemetery in 1929.



Clare, Graham and a team of volunteers will be focussing on the following areas in 2021/22:

Historical

To research and scope the current archive material held on and off site by the Northampton Saints, as well as reaching out to external people that have items of historical significance such as artefacts and photographs that they wish to donate to the club's archive. The findings from this activity will be used to support a grant funding bid to finance a long-term archiving and cataloguing project, to safeguard these important items.

Timeline

To work with the Club Historian to fill gaps in the club's history on the existing timeline and look to create a new informative timeline display throughout the Foundation building, to build the link between the Foundation's current offering right back to the Northampton Saint Rugby Club's origins as a youth improvement class run by the Reverend Watham Wigg in 1880. Through this research, we will look to develop detailed projects of findings and when they shine through, share them through the Club's website, social media and externally.

Education

To research appropriate heritage information that can be developed into an education programme, that can be shared with both primary and secondary schools to boost the existing school heritage offering.

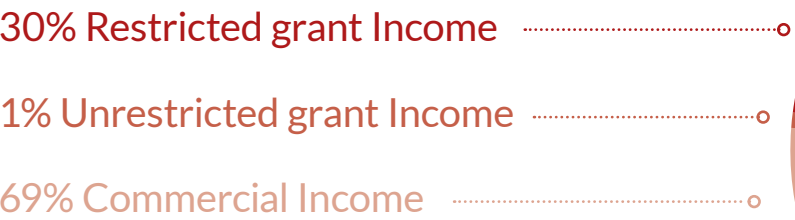

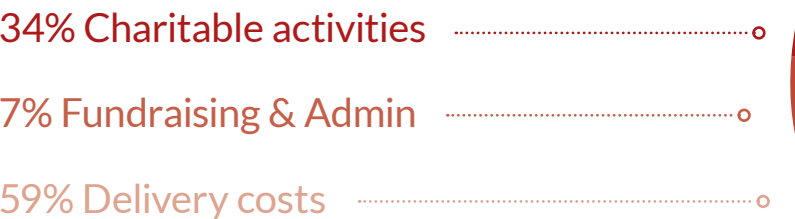
